




What is database?

Why do we use library's databases?




- Contents on the Web

96% of content on the Web are estimated to be outside of the surface web = they cannot be searched on Google, Yahoo, Bing, etc.

Why should you use ProQuest?




- UNLIKE the internet, ProQuest contains ONLY the contents that can be referenced for your essays & theses.
 - ⇒ ProQuest has little 'noise' or irrelevant information.
- Rich contents provide diverse perspectives.
 - ⇒ Views for & against regarding a particular idea or a policy
 - ⇒ Various views originated in different parts of the world
 - ⇒ Historic perspectives on the same topic that changed over the years
- Sophisticated search functionality that makes efficient information-gathering and research possible.




- How to change the interface language

 - Select the language of your choice.





 - Enter the keyword(s) into the search box.













 easily = You can try to narrow down your results with various terms and access more relevant contents quickly.



 - Display results the Scholarly Journal articles, that are categorized as 'Peer Reviewed'.
 - ➤ Open [Source type] ⇒ [Scholarly Journals]
 - ➤ Open [Peer reviewed] ⇒ [Peer reviewed]




- Checking the abstracts of articles from [Preview]
 - An efficient way to check if the article is relevant to your research






- Machine Translation
 - Abstract & Full Text(in HTML Format) can be machine-translated.







- Check the availability of Full Text with Link Resolver
 - Click for the articles WITHOUT full text.






- Basic Search & Narrowing Results
 - Example 3 : Search with 2 words Syrian & Refugee
 - Let's see the difference between AND Search & Exact-phrase Search.
 - AND Search: enter Syrian AND Refugee or simply Syrian Refugee into the search box.
 - Exact-phrase Search: enclose the 2 words with quotations or ", like "Syrian refugee".




Search Range of AND SEARCH

Image of AND SEARCH




The content has BOTH 'Syrian' and 'Refugee' (somewhere).

What is Exact-phrase SEARCH?



Image of Exact-phrase SEARCH




The 2 words Syrian Refugee that are enclosed with " are treated as though they are 1 word or a phrase.

Examples of Exact-phrase SEARCH

- "gender equality"
- "gravitational wave"
- "internet of things"
- "political economy"
- "to be, or not to be"

- Boolean Operators
 - Example 4: Search for documents that contain Global Warming OR Climate Change.
 - Use OR Search
 - OR Search: Connect two words with OR like "global warming" OR "climate change".








Search Range of AND SEARCH



The results contain **BOTH** Word 'A' and Word 'B'.


Image of AND SEARCH



The content has BOTH 'Global Warming' and 'Climate Change' (somewhere).



- The difference between Keyword Search & Subject Search
 - Example 5: Compare the results between the keyword searching and subject searching with a word Work Life Balance.
 - For Subject Searching, open [Advanced Search]
 ⇒ Enter "work life balance" ⇒ Change the dropdown to [Subject heading MAINSUBJECT]

Keyword Search



The content actually has the keyword(s) in its texts.
However, its main theme may be about different topics.


Subject Search



The content may not state the keyword anywhere in the texts. However, its main theme is about the keyword and therefore the content is strongly relevant.




- Advanced Search
 - Example 6: Display the full-text articles published since the beginning of 2018 which subject is Globalization and have either the words 'poverty' or 'inequality' in the titles.
- Subject heading (all):
 Globalization
- Document title TI: Poverty OR Inequality
- Limit to: Full text
- Publication date: After this date – January 1st 2018


- Search by Author's Name
 - Example 7: Search for the articles on iPS cells by Prof. Shinya Yamanaka.


- Using Thesaurus ①
 - Example 8 : Search for the similar terms & related terms of the word 'Market Strategy'
 - Open [Advanced Search] & click [Thesaurus]
 - Search within [ProQuest thesaurus (subjects)]



***Many databases included on the ProQuest platform have different versions of Thesaurus.** Therefore, # of displayed Thesaurus can vary at your institution.




- Using Thesaurus 2
 - Related and similar terms will be displayed below by clicking the little folder icon next to the keyword.
 - For searching with the similar and related terms, tick the boxes on the left and click [Add to search].





- Using Thesaurus 3
 - [BROADER TERMS] & [NARROWER TERMS] are displayed by clicking the search keyword itself. (Your keyword may have no broader or narrower terms.)
 - If your want to add the narrower terms to your search, you need to tick the boxes and click [Add to search].



4. Finding Scholarly Contents Quickly

- Advanced Search
 - Example 9: Search for articles published over the last 30 days that are about 'International Trade', but do not contain a word 'TPP' NOR 'Trans-Pacific Partnership'.
- Subject heading (all):
 "International Trade"
 *Search the keyword International Trade using ProQuest thesaurus (subjects).
- Anywhere: TPP OR Trans-Pacific Partnership
 +
 Change the dropdown on

the left to [NOT].




Limit to: Full text / Publication date: Last 30 Days

What is NOT SEARCH?



Search Range of NOT SEARCH



Search the contents that have Word 'A', but exclude results that also contain Word 'B'.

Image of NOT SEARCH




The content is about International Trade, but it does not have the word TPP nor trans-pacific partnership in the texts.


- NEAR Search (Proximity Search)
 - Example 10 : Search for the articles about 'Bitcoin' that contain the information of its criticism.
 - A NEAR/# B ('#' is for the number of words between A & B)
 - Search Strategy: Critics NEAR/5 Bitcoin OR Criticism NEAR/5 Bitcoin
 - The words "Critics" or "Criticism" can be found within 5 words either before or after "Bitcoin"
 - 'NEAR' has to be entered in CAPITAL LETTERS



- Accessing the specific issue (Vol.~) of a journal
 - Search the title from [Publication] page
 - Example 11: Find the latest issuance of The Economist





 - [Creating alert] allows you to receive the latest result documents under your strategy via e-mail










