Highlights

- Although quarterly growth slowed to 0.1% in Q1, this followed two very strong quarters and still means that the economy was 3.8% up on a year earlier, the fastest in the EU. Household consumption was the main driver of economic growth, up 6.6% year-on-year, comfortably its strongest rate since before the global financial crisis. And while Q2 may see some setback for consumption after the sharp rise in Q1, we expect a robust underlying trend in the coming quarters. By contrast, both government consumption and investment contracted in Q1, but the latter should start to pick up soon in response to the marked improvement in both exports and consumer spending over the last year. With regard to the external sector, the likely boost to exports from the gradual Eurozone recovery is likely to be outweighed by faster domestic demand sucking in more imports. Overall, we have raised our 2014 GDP growth forecast to 3% from 2.8% last month.
- CPI inflation was just 0.9% in May, the lowest on record. In large part, the latest decline was driven by
- we do not believe that the central bank will lower the policy interest rate any further (it last cut in February). The central bank attributes recent currency strength to external factors and it believes inflation will pick up in the coming months.
- The IMF remains confident in Romania's ability to implement meaningful structural reform. However, policymakers still need to make a lot of progress if they are to achieve the IMF targets. While Romgaz was privatised last year, energy sector assets Hidroelectrica and Oltenia have yet to be sold off. In addition, despite lively opposition from the IMF, the government will probably implement a 5% cut in the payroll tax rate as it looks to spur growth. Overall, though, the government remains committed to its policy goals and we believe it will continue to work towards meeting its fiscal targets and reform objectives.

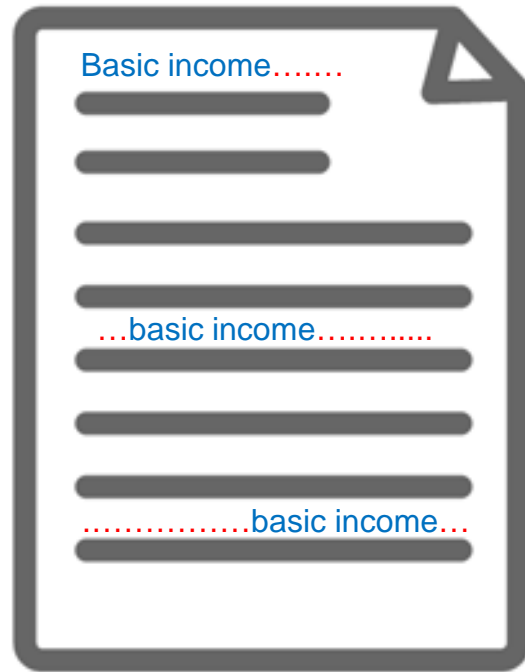

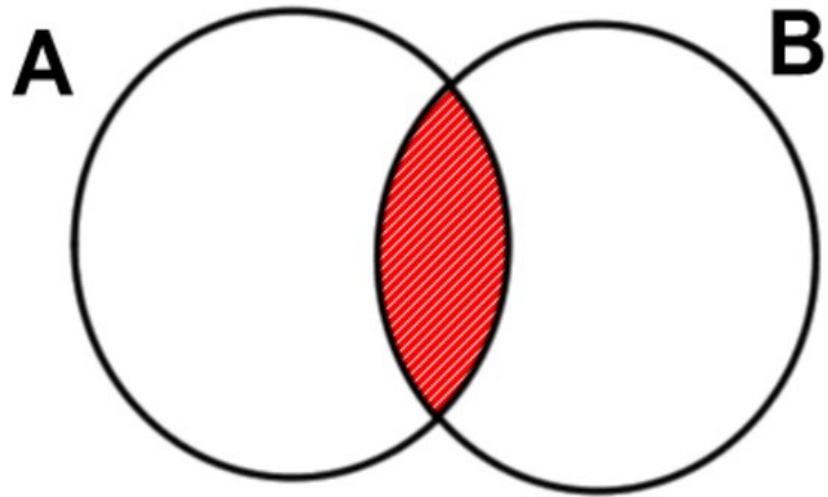

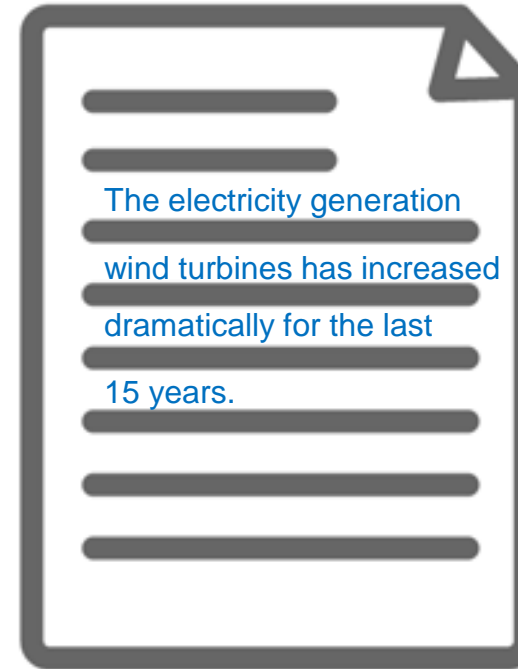

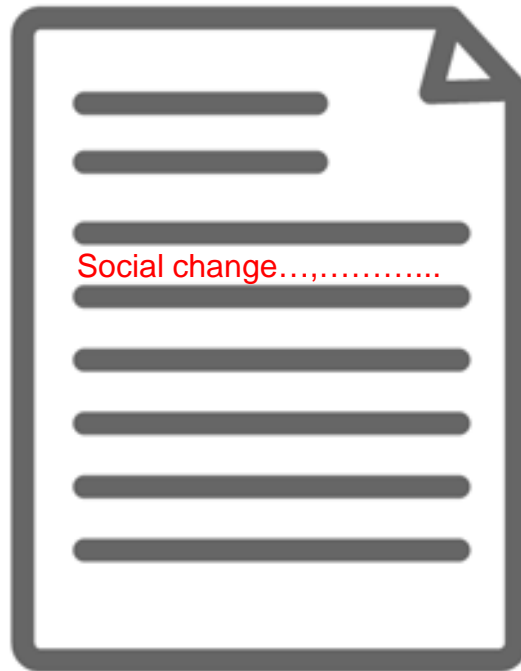
